The Mid North Coast Aboriginal Health Accord, established since 2014, includes five Partner entities: Healthy North Coast Primary Health Network, Durri Aboriginal Corporation Medical Service, Galambila Aboriginal Health Service, Werin Aboriginal Corporation and Mid North Coast Local Health District.

The Accord ensures that there is effective partnerships and meaningful collaboration focused on shared decision-making which are vital to achieving improvement in the health and wellbeing of Aboriginal communities.
