- Explain your rights and responsibilities
- Identify and advocate for your needs
- Support communication with staff
- Provide health education information
- Ensure services are culturally appropriate
- Assist in discharge planning
- Arrange for support services

As well as offering support to help you with feelings regarding:

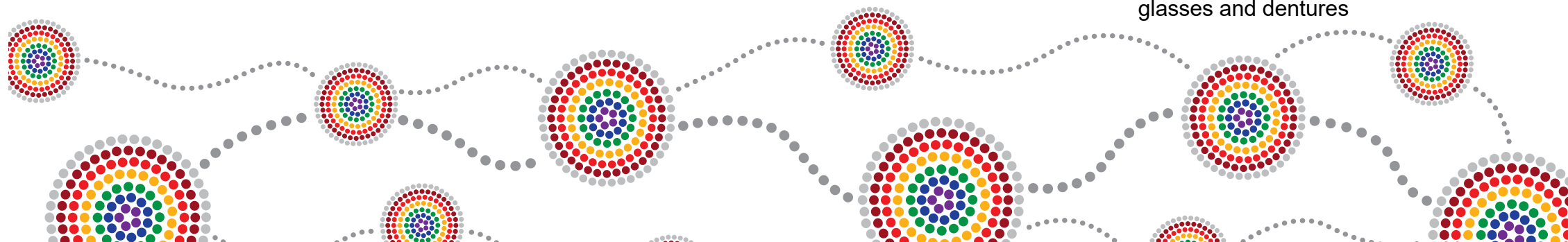
- Separation
- Sorry business, grief or loss issues
- Uncertainty or loneliness about being in unfamiliar surroundings
- Anxiety about your illness

- IPTAAS (Isolated Patient Transport and Accommodation Assistance Scheme)
- My Aged Care

- Clothing: night wear, dressing gown and non-slip slippers or shoes, toiletries, glasses and dentures
