  - (i) working with the Health Education and Training Institute to develop, provide and promote training and education programs;
  - (ii) identifying priorities for and promoting the conduct of research about clinical quality and safety in health care;
- review adverse clinical incidents arising in the NSW public health system and develop responses to those incidents including (but not limited to)
  - (i) co-ordinating responses to specific incidents with system or statewide implications; and
  - (ii) providing advice to the Secretary on urgent or emergent patient safety issues and staff safety issues in a clinical setting;
- monitor clinical quality and safety processes and performance of public health organisations and to report to the Secretary and Minister thereon;
- provide the Bureau of Health Information with relevant data on clinical quality and safety performance of the public health system to support the Bureau's public reporting function;
- consult broadly with public health organisations, health professionals and members of the community in performing its functions;
- provide advice to the Secretary and Minister for Health on issues arising out of its functions;
- develop three-year Strategic Plans and an Annual Work Plan, linking these activities and priorities of the Commission to the statewide directions and priorities of NSW and work in accordance with these plans and Service Compact agreed with the Secretary.
