

Dr Teresa Anderson, AM, FIPPA, PhD, B.App.Sc (Speech Pathology)

Current roles

Sydney Local Health District, Chief Executive

Dr Anderson is responsible for the strategic and operational management of Sydney Local Health District (SLHD) which has an annual budget of \$2.21b and employs over 14,000 staff.

SLHD is one of 15 Local Health Districts (LHDs) in NSW Health and is located in the centre and inner west of Sydney, made up of the Local Government Areas of the City of Sydney (part), Inner West Council, Canterbury-Bankstown (part), Canada Bay, Burwood, and Strathfield. It covers a geographic area of approximately 126 square kilometres. SLHD has the following services and hospitals: Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, (Australia's premier quaternary and tertiary hospital), Concord Hospital (a leading tertiary hospital), Canterbury and Balmain Hospitals, Sydney Dental Hospital, Community Health, Mental Health, Drug Health and Population Health services.

Dr Anderson has a well-established reputation for implementing strategies to foster innovation and best practice, supporting collaboration and building partnerships, to provide excellent healthcare to almost 740,000 people living within Sydney Local Health District and the million people who come into the District each day to work, study and visit and many more that travel from rural and remote parts of NSW and Australia to receive treatment.

Dr Anderson, as Chief Executive of SLHD, is responsible for the management and control of the affairs of Sydney Local Health District. With the SLHD Board, Dr Anderson has steered the strategic direction of SLHD, ensuring robust governance, compliance with statutory mandates, and the delivery of health services that have exceed budgetary and performance standards.

Under Dr Anderson's leadership, SLHD has continued to perform at Performance level 1 since established in 2011. Dr Anderson has been responsible for overseeing the performance of statutory functions, with a strong focus on safety, quality, and financial accountability including budget management.

Dr Anderson has been responsible for building sustainable community partnerships, fostering stakeholder relationships across the LHD, other MoH services and other government January 2011 – current

and community organisations. Dr Anderson continues to develop programs and services to support and improve the health and wellbeing of all people in the community.

Under Dr Anderson's leadership, SLHD has continued to work to improve the health outcomes of those most vulnerable in the community, including community members living rough or in unstable accommodation and to support the health and wellbeing of patients from rural and remote communities through partnerships with rural LHDs particularly Far West NSW and Western NSW such as the vICU between RPA and Broken Hill.

The traditional custodians of the land in SLHD are the Gadigal, Wangal and Bediagal people of the Eora Nation. Around one per cent of the population of residents within the SLHD area identify as being of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage. Dr Anderson and SLHD are committed to working with our partners, in particular, the Aboriginal Medical Services Redfern and the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council to achieve improved health outcomes for our First Nations Peoples.

SLHD is rich in cultural and social diversity and is home to a large number of established and emerging Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Communities. Approximately 46 percent of SLHD's population speak a language other than English at home, including significant numbers of refugees, asylum seekers and special humanitarian entrants. A feature of SLHD's social diversity is our proud lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex and queer (LGBTIQ+) community. A number of our suburbs have the highest proportions of same-sex couples in Australia.

Under Dr Anderson's leadership, SLHD has continued its well-established reputation for excellence in the provision of healthcare services and for managerial and fiscal responsibility. SLHD has strong and well recognised leadership roles in research, education and in the provision of high quality tertiary and quaternary clinical services.

Dr Anderson has led the development of a very strong academic culture within SLHD with the research and education enterprise enhanced by its unique relationship with the University of Sydney and the eleven Medical Research Institutes and Centres located within the District.

Dr Anderson has also continued to play a leadership in the the broader NSW public health system fostering a culture of innovation and collaboration. Dr Anderson played a significant role in the NSW Health pandemic response, in partnership with the State Health Emergency Operations Centre (SHEOC). Dr Anderson led the establishment and management of the Special Health Accommodation (which managed over 23,000 patients), rpaVirtual Hospital which cared for more than 60,000 COVID-19 patients in the

community and the NSW Health Vaccination Centre at Sydney Olympic Park which vaccinated over 1.6 M people.
